AN ORDINANCE DENYING A ZONE CHANGE FOR A TRACT OF LAND DESCRIBED AS LOT 2, BLOCK 5, OF THE PARK TERRACE ADDITION TO THE TOWN OF LAMESA, DAWSON COUNTY, TEXAS, FROM DISTRICT R-1 (SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL) BUT GRANTING A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT FOR THE USE OF THE PROPERTY AS A HAIR SALON.

On the this 25th day of August 2015, there came on and was held at the regular meeting place, the City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, and there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the following ordinance was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, to wit:

**WHEREAS**, the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lamesa provides that the zoning districts of said city may be changed upon application of the property owner and upon recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, an application to the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Lamesa, Texas, has been to change the zoning of the following described property located at 204 N. Avenue S, Lamesa, Texas, from a District R-1 (Single-family Residential) to allow the use of the following described property as a hair salon, to-wit:

All of Lot 2, Block 5, of the Park Terrace Addition to the Town of Lamesa, Dawson County, Texas; and

**WHEREAS**, said property is located within the city limits of the City of Lamesa, Texas, located at 204 N Avenue S, and is within a district zoned as R-1 (Single-family residential); and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Lamesa, Texas, after hearing such application and the arguments for and against the same, has voted to recommend to the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, that such request for a change in the zoning of such property be denied. An appeal was requested by the owner of said property. The City Council, after hearing the argument for and against the same, has voted that a specific use permit for the use of the property as a hair salon be granted; and

**SECTION ONE:** That the request to change the zoning of the following described property located at 204 N. Avenue S, Lamesa, Texas, from a District R-1 (Single-family Residential) to allow the use of the following described property as a hair salon, to-wit:

All of Lot 2, Block 5, of the Park Terrace Addition to the Town of Lamesa, Dawson County, Texas;

be denied, but that a **specific use permit** for the use of the property as a hair salon be, and is hereby, **Granted**.

**SECTION TWO:** The provisions of this ordinance are to be cumulative and shall constitute an amendment to the zoning ordinance of the City of Lamesa, Texas, only as it applies to the hereinabove described property.

**SECTION THREE:** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

**SECTION FOUR:** The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish the descriptive caption of this ordinance in the manner and for the length of time prescribed by Article IV, Section 24 of the City Charter.

Upon being put to a vote, the foregoing ordinance was Passed, on First Reading on the 18th day of August, 2015, by a majority vote; and then on the 25th day of August, 2015, there came on and was held at the regular meeting place, the City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, and there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the foregoing ordinance was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, and upon being put to a vote, the foregoing ordinance was Passed on Second and Final Reading and Adopted this 25th day of August, 2015 by a majority vote and ordered to be spread upon the minutes of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas and recorded in the ordinance book thereafter.

#### PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This agreement is made by and between the "City of Lamesa" and Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Department of Psychiatry, through the Southwest Institute for Addictive Diseases, hereinafter called "TTUHSC," witnesseth:

#### ARTICLE I SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED

Whereas the City of Lamesa desires to provide an Employee Assistance Program (EAP) to benefit its employees and volunteer firefighters and TTUHSC desires to deliver such professional services, the two parties agree as set forth below:

- 1. TTUHSC agrees to provide EAP services in the form of initial assessment, short term counseling, and referral interviews up to a maximum of eight (8) sessions per covered individual per year. Should a covered individual seek and obtain treatment and/or counseling beyond the maximum of eight (8) sessions from any other source recommended by TTUHSC, the City of Lamesa is responsible to inform the individual that it is his/her responsibility to pay all costs for additional treatment and/or counseling.
- 2. TTUHSC agrees to provide EAP services to members of the immediate family of individuals covered under this contract without receiving any additional compensation. Such services to a covered individual's family members shall be provided within the maximum of sessions (eight) specified in number one (#1) above. Immediate family member is defined as spouse, child, parents, siblings, or any other dependent living in the same household with the covered individual. The City of Lamesa is responsible to determine who is eligible for services under this program.
- 3. TTUHSC agrees to provide a 24-hour Helpline and a 1-800 number to all employees of the City of Lamesa and their family members.
- 4. TTUHSC agrees to provide intervention and crisis counseling services including critical incident stress de-briefing sessions when requested by the City of Lamesa.
- 5. TTUHSC agrees to provide EAP orientations, when requested, to employees and volunteer firefighters of the City of Lamesa and to provide training for supervisors to perform their role within the EAP on an as-needed basis.
- 6. TTUHSC agrees to provide educational seminars and preventative services (e.g., stress management, effective communication, and healthy relationships) to the City of Lamesa when requested. These educational seminars and preventative services will be provided at no additional cost to the City of Lamesa.
- 7. TTUHSC agrees to provide supervisor training and consultation services to the City of Lamesa when requested. This would also include organizational and management consultations. These supervisory and management training seminars and consultations will be provided at no additional cost to the City of Lamesa.

- 8. The City of Lamesa agrees to designate someone to work with the EAP Director to publicize EAP services, plan health promotion activities and training seminars, and evaluate services.
- 9. TTUHSC agrees to provide brochures and posters to the City of Lamesa for purposes of publicizing the EAP program.
  - 10. Employees are responsible for notifying and arranging time off with their supervisor if they must enter treatment programs (in-patient and out-patient). TTUHSC agrees to work with the employee's supervisor in arranging for a smooth and positive re-entry into the work environment (in accordance with the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993) and as an advocate for those employees who have been off the job in order to receive treatment. TTUHSC will assume the advocacy role only when the employee has given written consent or in the event of a mandatory referral by the supervisor related to poor job performance.
  - 11. TTUHSC agrees to provide frequent consultations with the management of the City of Lamesa regarding employees referred to in-patient and out-patient treatment settings only when employees have given written consent.
  - 12. TTUHSC agrees to provide follow-up services and make assessments of a troubled employee's progress for up to one year after initial intake when the employee has given written consent. Such follow-up will not be counted against the eight (8) visits offered under the contract.
- 13. TTUHSC agrees to provide the City of Lamesa with quarterly and annual utilization statistical reports for management review.
- 14. TTUHSC agrees to assist the City of Lamesa in educating all employees to meet the requirements of the Drug-Free Work Place Act.
- 15. It is agreed by both parties that in order to protect the confidentiality of employees of the City of Lamesa, names and other information that may identify specific employees or family members who have used the service shall not be included in quarterly or annual statistical utilization reports. Both parties hereto recognize that information that is confidential under the Texas Open Records Act may not be released except pursuant to an Attorney General decision or court order.

#### ARTICLE II COMPENSATION

The City of Lamesa agrees to a payment rate of \$22.40 per covered individual per 12-month period. This rate shall be based on the total number of individuals covered by this contract with the City of Lamesa which is 113 as of date of execution of this agreement. The estimated total payment rate for this number of individuals is \$2,531.20 per year. This number is subject to quarterly review and may be renegotiated by the parties to this agreement in the event of significant changes in the employment census at the City of Lamesa or in the event that TTUHSC can document that services are being utilized at a rate exceeding the annual payment amount.

Payments to TTUHSC shall be made quarterly (\$632.80 each installment). TTUHSC shall send a quarterly statement of charges to the City of Lamesa. Payments shall be remitted within 30 days of receipt of statement and should be made to Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Department of Psychiatry, 3601 4<sup>th</sup> Street – STOP 8103, Lubbock, TX 79430, Attention: Alan Korinek, Ph.D. All payments required to be made by either party to this Agreement shall be made from current revenues available to the paying party.

Neither party to this agreement will bill these services to a third party insurer.

## ARTICLE III TERM AND TERMINATION

This contract shall become effective on <u>September 1, 2015</u> and shall end on <u>August 31, 2016</u> unless previously terminated pursuant to this article (Article III) or extended by mutual agreement in writing <u>prior</u> to date of expiration.

Either party may terminate this contract at any time with or without cause by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice of termination. This agreement shall terminate immediately upon nonpayment. The City of Lamesa is responsible to notify employees and volunteer firefighters that services are no longer available.

### ARTICLE IV INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

Nothing in this agreement is intended nor shall be construed to create an employer/employee relationship between the contracting parties. TTUHSC shall be deemed at all times to be an independent contractor. The sole interest and responsibility of the parties is to perform the services covered by this agreement in a competent, efficient, and satisfactory manner. In carrying out the terms of this contract, TTUHSC shall select its own employees and such employees shall be and act under the control of their employer.

#### ARTICLE V SEVERABILITY

If any term or provision of this agreement is held to be invalid for any reason, the invalidity of that section shall not affect the validity of any other section of this agreement provided that any invalid provisions are not material to the overall purpose and operation of this agreement. The remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated.

#### ARTICLE VI ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall have the right to assign or transfer their rights to any third parties under this agreement.

On this the 25<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2015, there came on and was held at the regular meeting place, City Hall, an open meeting of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas held pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act (Art. 6252-17); there being a quorum present and acting throughout the meeting, the following resolution was formally submitted by motion and duly seconded for the consideration and action of the meeting, to-wit:

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Lamesa desires to amend the Personnel Policy of the City of Lamesa with respect to certain changes to the policy; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Lamesa finds that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City of Lamesa to pass a resolution effecting said amendments;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS:

That the Personnel Policy of the City of Lamesa shall be amended to include Section 7.008.002 and Section 3.01.02a contained in "Exhibit A" attached to this resolution and that all changes so enacted shall become effective immediately upon passage of said resolution and that all employees of the City of Lamesa shall be governed by said amendments from this date forward.

Upon being put to a vote, the resolution was Passed, Approved, and Adopted this 25<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2015 by a majority vote and ordered to be spread upon the minutes of the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas and recorded in the resolution book thereafter.

#### SECTION ONE: REQUISITION AND RECRUITMENT

#### 3:01.01. JOB REQUISITIONS

#### A. Determination of Staffing Needs.

Department Heads will be responsible for determination of departmental staffing needs. Efforts will be made to assess future staffing needs based upon anticipated workloads and normal instances of employee turnover in order to give sufficient time for recruitment, selection, and appointment of new employees.

(1) City position(s) left vacant for any reason for more than 90 days may be filled by the department head as he/she deems necessary, upon approval of city manager, to maintain the efficient level of services for the City of Lamesa

#### B. Requisition Procedure.

Upon determination of a staffing need, the department head should submit a requisition on a prescribed form to the personnel department.

#### C. Approval Required.

Approval by the city manager is required before any action is taken by the department head to fill any position.

#### 3:01.02. RECRUITMENT

Every reasonable effort will made to publicize job openings so that all interested persons including qualified individual(s) with a disability are informed of the opening. All job openings, except those requiring a professional certification for entry, will be filed with the local office of the Texas Employment Commission, and with such other organizations and individuals as the personnel director may deem appropriate.

The city's employment practices prohibit discrimination on the basis of a disability with respect to job application procedures, hiring, advancement, discharge, compensation, job training, and other terms, conditions, and privileges of employment

#### 3:01.02 (A) BACKGROUND CHECKS

City of Lamesa believes that hiring qualified individuals contributes to our overall strategic success. Background checks serve as an important part of the selection process. The information we collect helps the City of Lamesa promote a safe work environment for our current and future employees. Background checks also help us obtain information necessary to determine an applicant's overall employability and to ensure the protection of the City of Lamesa's physical property, proprietary

information and other assets on. The City of Lamesa complies with all applicable federal, state and local laws, including fair employment practices and equal employment opportunity, when conducting background checks.

At the City of Lamesa background checks will be conducted on all job applicants applying for depending on positions. These include positions involving security and financial responsibilities, as well as other positions determined by the City of Lamesa to be sensitive. The City of Lamesa will use a third-party agency to conduct the background checks to verify the accuracy of the information provided by the applicant during the selection process. Information collected by the agency includes past employment, education, character, finances and reputation.

The City of Lamesa will ensure that all background checks are conducted in compliance with all applicable federal and state statutes, such as the Fair Credit Reporting Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The information that can be collected from previous employers and other sources will be limited to that which is job-related and pertains to the quality and quantity of work performed by the applicant and to the applicant's attendance record, education and other lawful, work-related inquiries. The human resource department along with appropriate management personnel will be primarily responsible for the background check process.

#### (1)Arrest and Conviction records

The City of Lamesa may check criminal arrest and conviction records and moving traffic violations as part of the applicant selection process. In accord with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's current interpretation of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, this information cannot be used as a basis for denying employment, unless it is determined to be job-related and consistent with business necessity.

#### (2)Credit Reports

The City of Lamesa may collect credit information on applicants consistent with the guidelines set forth by the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA). The FCRA requires organizations to obtain a candidate's written authorization before obtaining a credit report. When doing this, the employer must: Certify to the consumer-reporting agency that the employer is in compliance with the FCRA and will not misuse the information it receives. Disclose to the applicant or employee, on a separate form, its plans to obtain a consumer or investigative consumer report and that the information received will be used solely for employment purposes. Inform the individual of his or her right to request additional information on the

nature of the report and the means through which such information may be obtained. Inform the applicant that the report will include information about the individual's character, general reputation and personal characteristics. Provide the individual with a summary of his or her rights under the FCRA. If the results of the credit check are negative, the City of Lamesa will inform the applicant before taking adverse action based on the results, provide the applicant with a Statement of Consumer Rights from the Federal Trade Commission, offer the applicant the opportunity to review a copy of the credit report, and advise the applicant of his or her rights to dispute inaccurate information. Applicants should be granted reasonable time to dispute the information (approximately three to five days).

#### (3)Record-Keeping

The City of Lamesa assures applicants that all information obtained from the background check process will only be used as part of the employment process and will be kept strictly confidential. The City of Lamesa's human resources will maintain a log that will include the position you are applying for, your name and the date of the background check. Only appropriate human resource personnel at the City of Lamesa will have access to this information. The City of Lamesa complies with all federal and state laws regarding the collection, storing and disposal of applicant information.

#### **SECTION TWO: APPLICATION**

#### 3:02.01. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION

All persons seeking employment will be required to complete, sign, and submit a standard application for employment, except in those administrative and department head positions where a more detailed personal resume may be required.

The application will include only such information relevant to selection on a non-discriminatory basis. Misstatements of material fact, omissions, or any apparent deception or fraud on an application will require rejection of the application or dismissal of the employee.

#### 3:02.02. RECORD OF JOB APPLICANTS

A record will be kept of all job applicants in the order of applications received and will include information as to the applicants sex, ethnic group, position applied for, and the status of the application. All records and applications will be kept on file for at least two years.

#### SECTION THREE: SELECTION

#### 3:03.01. BASIS FOR SELECTION

#### SECTION SIX: WORKER'S COMPENSATION

#### 7:06.01. COVERAGE

Any employee of the City of Lamesa who is injured on the job while in the performance of assigned duties shall be covered and entitled to payment of compensation under the provisions of the Texas Worker's Compensation Act, with the City providing such coverage through an insurance carrier.

#### 7:06.02. PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

During the period when the employee is on leave due to injury or occupational disease, such employee's compensation shall consist of weekly benefits payable under the provisions of the Texas Worker's Compensation Act. (See 7:01.03.(C).(2). Wage Continuation Benefits)

#### 7:06.03. FITNESS TO RETURN TO WORK

The injured employee's fitness to return to work shall be determined under the provisions of the Texas Worker's Compensation Act (Article 8306, Section 12a).

#### 7:06.04. REPORTING OF ON THE JOB INJURIES

Any employee who becomes injured while on the job will report any such injury to the immediate supervisor. Supervisor will take such steps as necessary to secure proper first aid or other treatment for the injured employee. The employee's supervisor will also complete an "Supervisors Injury "report" and file it with the personnel director. Supervisors who fail to fill out a report on a prescribed form will be discipline for such action. (See 7:01.03.(B) Reporting of On the Job Injuries)

#### **SECTION SEVEN: CREDIT UNION**

#### 7:07.01. MEMBERSHIP

Full-time regular employees of the City of Lamesa may be eligible for membership in the Caprock Federal Credit Union, under rules and conditions set by the credit union.

#### 7:07.02. PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS FOR CREDIT UNION

Upon application to the finance director, employees may arrange for payroll deductions to be made for deposit to the employee's credit union savings account and/or for repayment of loans from the credit union.

#### SECTION EIGHT: REST BREAKS

#### 7:08.01. REST PERIODS PERMITTED

Duties permitting, office employees will be allowed a fifteen (15) minute rest period during the morning and again in the afternoon. When practicable on the job, outside employees may be permitted a similar rest period. Such rest periods

are not to interfere with normal duties or functions of the office nor will they be cumulative in any respect. Rest breaks are considered a privilege and not a right. Abuse of this privilege may be grounds for disciplinary action. Rest periods will be allowed at discretion of Department Head.

#### 7.08.01 (a) NURSING MOTHER

The City provides reasonable break time for an employee to express breast milk for her nursing child for 1 year after the child's birth, each time the employee has need to express the milk. The employer provides a place other than a bathroom, that is shielded from view and free from intrusion from coworkers and the public, which may be used by an employee to express breast milk. Whenever possible, the area contains a clean, safe water source and a sink for washing hands and a rinsing out any needed breast-pumping equipment.

A refrigerator for expressed milk. Expressed milk must be stored in a container clearly labeled with the mother's first and last name, telephone extension, and date. Containers with expressed milk with dates over 7 days old will be removed.

A nursing mother who returns to work full-time may take breaks for lactation purposes. Generally, the amount of time for breaks will be the same as under the break policy. The timing of the break can be altered to best accommodate the nursing mother and her work schedule.

#### SECTION NINE: EXTRA PAY

#### 7:09.01. AMOUNT AND ELIGIBILITY

The City Council at its discretion may grant extra pay to employees. The amount of pay and eligibility for such pay will be set at the time it is granted; except that any employee who is on any form of leave of absence without pay, including suspensions, shall not be eligible for extra pay.

#### SECTION TEN: EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

#### 7:10.01. GENERAL POLICY

The City of Lamesa recognizes that an employee's personal problems not directly associated with the job can have an effect upon the employee's health and/or job performance. These problems may be attributed to medical reasons, such as alcohol or drug dependence, or personal and emotional problems. If these problems interfere with the employee's job performance and the employee is unable to solve the problem without assistance, then it is in the City's interest to help deal with such problems. The Employee Assistance Program will offer appropriate professional services, under guidelines of strict confidentiality, to all employees and their dependents.

#### 7:10.02. ELIGIBILITY

All employees of the City of Lamesa and their dependent family members are eligible to participate in the Employee Assistance Program.

#### 7:10.03. POLICY AND GUIDELINES
